Windmills are an iconic feature of the Greek landscapes.

Giannikos' philosophy is to unite tradition and new technology. That is why they cultivate organic and harvest and prune carefully by hand.

Background:

This wine originates in Corinth. The vineyard is cultivated strictly organic because we are convinced that only naturally grown vines can produce healthy grapes that are the base of our quality wines.

Another aspect is the influence of the sea to the microclimate. The cooling winds together with the Mediterranean sun and the soil provide the best conditions for the indigenous and selected international grape varieties.

Greece has a rich heritage of indigenous grape varieties. To honour this heritage, and because of the strong characteristics and local attachment, they have planted Greek varieties like this Roditis.



Tasting notes:

Light green-yellow color, intensively aromatic with clear scents of apricot, peach, pear and a natural hint of lemon peel. Well balanced with a fresh acidity.

Grape variety

100% Malagouzia. This is an indigenous grape variety of Greece.

Vinification

Hand-picked and hand-sorted, skin-contact fermentation in stainless steel tanks at a constant low temperature.

Made with Organic Grapes

Organically Farmed – No chemical pesticides or herbicides used.
